As a Welsh choir they sing in the traditional 4-part male voice style (1st & 2nd Tenor, Baritone and Bass) and a good proportion of their repertoire is in the Welsh language. The choir has something of a cult following in and around Oxford and a well-deserved reputation for excellent, engaging and entertaining performances.
