Update on Shipton Church from Geoffrey following the recent roof inspection of the rest of the church:

"The good news is that the North aisle roof is fine. He looked at the Chancel roof and saw no indications of rot or beetle infestation, and the same with the west end. However, the Lady Chapel roof had some significant rot in places. The problems were all centred around areas where the guttering is prone to flood due to blockages. So at the west end of the lady chapel there were no significant issues. The timber specialist seemed to be of the opinion that the main trusses are generally sound and held up by the upright posts and corbels but that the ends set in the wall on some of the trusses would need repair/replacing. We need to await his report and of course the report from architect and structural engineer. The trusses that show signs of falling dust were apparently solid on the inside and only the outside had been eaten - something to do with the beetles eating the "sap-wood" and not the core.""
