PRAYERS AND READINGS

Collect Eternal God, as Mary waited for the birth of your Son, so we wait for his coming in glory; bring us through the birth pangs of this present age to see, with her, our great salvation in Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Post Communion Heavenly Father, who chose the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the mother of the promised saviour: fill us your servants with your grace, that in all things we may embrace your holy will and with her rejoice in your salvation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Readings: (Year A)

First Reading Romans 1:1-7 Paul introduces himself to the Roman church and offers his credentials. He states that he has been "called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God...concerning his Son".

Gospel Matthew 1:18-end The Gospel writer tells how the birth of Jesus came about, and how an angel of the Lord persuaded Joseph that he should take Mary to be his wife, despite her early pregnancy.

Readings (Year A) **First Reading Hebrews 1:1-4 [5-12]** The writer explains that Christ is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's being. He was involved in creation and sustains all things. After purifying our sins he sat down at God's right hand, superior even to angels.

Gospel John 1:1-14 John sets out the main themes of his book in this prologue and introduces us to the idea of Jesus as the Word, an intrinsic part of all creation.

Readings First Sunday of Christmas

First Reading Hebrews 2:10-end Because of Jesus, we know that God does not stand apart from human beings in any part of our experience. Rather, God is with us even in the depths of our own suffering.

Gospel Matthew 2:13-end This is a story in three parts, each one fulfilling an Old Testament scripture. At the heart of it we see Mary, Joseph and Jesus fleeing as refugees from one land to another, seeking safety.
