### Liturgy of the Palms Gospel Matthew 21:1-11

Having commanded two of his disciples to untie a donkey and bring it to him, Jesus rides into Jerusalem as the crowds praise and glorify him.

## Liturgy of the Passion First Reading Isaiah 50:4-9a

God blesses us with the gifts we need, such as fortitude and resolve. However hard things may get, if we stay true to God, God will help us.

## Second Reading Philippians 2:5-11

Paul exhorts his readers to imitate Christ, who in humility took the form of a slave, being born in human likeness and obedient to God's will. Therefore Christ is exalted above all others.

The account of the passion of Christ.

### Holy Week Readings

#### Maundy Thursday

Thursday 9 April 2020

### First Reading Exodus 12:1-4 [5-10] 11-14

The Passover is instituted. Each family is to eat a lamb, in haste, putting its blood on the doorposts. This is a sign that the Lord should pass over the Israelite houses when he strikes Egypt.

### Second Reading | Corinthians | 1:23-26

Paul describes the institution of the Lord's Supper. He explains that we are proclaiming the Lord's death until he comes.

#### Gospel John 13:1-17. 31b-35

Jesus washes the disciples' feet. Peter objects because he thinks it is beneath him, but Jesus insists. He goes on to explain that soon he will not be with them and that they cannot go where he is going. He gives them a new commandment, that they should love one another as he has loved them.

#### Easter Day

Sunday 12 April 2020

#### First Reading Acts 10:34-43

Peter challenges the prevailing society by witnessing to the truths of Christ's life, death and resurrection.

#### Gospel

#### Matthew 28:1-10

Faithful women witness to the resurrection with sight, touch and sound, before being commissioned by Christ as his first evangelists.
