## SUNDAY 17 MAY 2020 – EASTER 6/ ROGATION SUNDAY

**Rogation Sunday.** Traditionally Rogation Sunday was the time when in the middle ages people would go out into the fields and ask God to bless crops that had been sown. Before the reformation great processions would go out from the parishes with banners and process around the parish boundaries. This was the start of the “Beating the Bounds” tradition whereby people would beat the boundary of the parish with sticks, marking their territory you might say.

Our service on Sunday will be an occasion to reflect and give thanks for the surrounding countryside, its beauty and its industry.

### PRAYERS AND READINGS

**Collect** Risen Christ, by the lakeside you renewed your call to your disciples: help your Church to obey your command and draw the nations to the fire of your love, to the glory of God the Father. **Amen**

**Post Communion** God our Father, whose Son Jesus Christ gives the water of eternal life: may we thirst for you, the spring of life and source of goodness, through him who is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen**

**Readings: (Year A)** Sixth Sunday of Easter Sunday 17 May 2020 – Rogation Sunday

**First Reading Acts 17:22-31** Paul introduces the Athenians to their “unknown God”.

**Second Reading I Peter 3:13-end** To suffer justly, though hard, enables a clean conscience which, purified through baptism, leads to God.

**Gospel John 14:15-21** Jesus prepares the disciples for his imminent departure from them and promises the comfort of the Holy Spirit.

### Update on Church buildings

The Church of England has now given permission for limited access to our church buildings. The incumbent or other designated person can go into church to say their prayers and carry out other activities: clock winding, ringing a bell on Sundays (but not full circle bellringing, just chiming) checking on the organ and cleaning amongst other things. But there is still the reminder to go in alone or with someone from the same household.

With this in mind Anne and I will be going into church to say our prayers and between us will be praying in all 4 of our churches at some point during the week.

There is also permission for using the church buildings for streaming or filming services, so our Sunday services will now have more varied locations.

Longer term the Government’s COVID19 Recovery Strategy says: “...churches could be open from July as part of the continual and phased plan to begin lifting the lockdown.” Please note, it says “could” so we must wait and see.
