# **Shipton Church Update**

Things are starting to move again with the work on the roof. Last week a Bat Survey was carried at at the church, and next week the Architect and Structural Engineer are coming to look at the outside of the roof. It is hoped that we will be able to get contractors to submit tenders for the work.

# Update on Church buildings

The Church of England has now given permission for limited access to our church buildings. The incumbent or other designated person can go into church to say their prayers and carry out other activities: clock winding, ringing a bell on Sundays (but not full circle bellringing, just chiming) checking on the organ and cleaning amongst other things. But there is still the reminder to go in alone or with someone from the same household.

With this in mind Anne and I will be going into church to say our prayers and between us will be praying in all 4 of our churches at some point during the week. There is also permission for using the church buildings for streaming or filming services, so our Sunday services will now have more varied locations.

Longer term the Government's COVID19 Recovery Strategy says: "...churches could be open from July as part of the continual and phased plan to begin lifting the lockdown." Please note, it says "could" so we must wait and see.
