5 July - Trinity 4 Readings

First Reading Genesis 24:34-38. 42-49. 58-end The testimony of Abraham's servant, that the Lord has greatly blessed his master.

Second Reading Romans 7:15-25a Paul expresses his internal conflict. His decision to obey God's law is continually overthrown by his sinful nature's desires. Only Christ's power, not his own effort, can set him free.

Gospel Matthew 11:16-19. 25-end Jesus laments the spiritual dullness of God's people, but rejoices at those willing to receive him as God's Son and the way to the Father. He invites the oppressed to draw close, promising them rest in his loving presence.

Opening up the churches after lockdown

Churches are open for private prayer

All our churches are now open daily with signs on the doors explaining how to safely enter the churches for private prayer.

Record of those entering our churches

If you are entering any of the churches, It would be helpful to sign in (ideally with your own pen). This will help us if anyone subsequently becomes unwell and it will also help those cleaning or carrying out other work, to have an idea of how many people have been in the church and when.

Sunday Services in Church from 5 July

Our initial plan is to hold one Communion service per Sunday and move around the 4 places of worship in the benefice. Given that numbers attending each service may be restricted can we ask that you avoid visiting another church if possible. Of course, no one will be turned away but please try to be aware of what sort of seating capacity each church may have if "social distancing" is applied. As August is only a month away and some people will be away on holiday (myself included) this pattern of services will run until mid-September when it will be reviewed.

The weekly online service will continue throughout July but not in August when Geoffrey is on annual leave.

How church services will be different

See the accompanying document sent out with the church news (and on the website) for more details. The following is an outline:

- People will need to be greeted and shown to their seats
- Everyone will be asked to use hand sanitizer on entering church

- Holy Communion will be bread only the celebrant will use hand sanitizer at the start of the service, at the offertory and immediately before the distribution of communion
- Currently singing is not permitted but this does not mean we cannot have music in our services
- We ask you please not to come if you are unwell
- Please wear a mask or covering, if you would prefer to.
