The shop will be open and there will be a short talk by Henry Astor about their produce and exciting plans for the future.

PRAYERS AND READINGS

Collect Holy God, faithful and unchanging: enlarge our minds with the knowledge of your truth, and draw us more deeply into the mystery of your love, that we may truly worship you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

Post Communion Almighty and eternal God, you have revealed yourself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and live and reign in the perfect unity of love: hold us firm in this faith, that we may know you in all your ways and evermore rejoice in your eternal glory, who are three Persons yet one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading Romans 8:12-17 This is Paul at his most vivid, joyful, and enthusiastic. His excitement for his faith bubbles up as he tells his readers that, when we call to God, the Spirit – God's very self – joins with us.

Gospel John 3:1-17 Nicodemus, a Jewish leader, has a powerful encounter with Jesus. Jesus speaks in mystical language about life, new birth, and the Spirit. It is too overwhelming for the Pharisee.

Pattern of Services

We are pleased to now return to a more normal pattern of services. A rota of services is available on the wychwoodbenefice.org.uk/rota-of-services-may-december-2021/ or email the office.

The next step on the Government Road takes effect from 17 May.

For services this will not mean any great changes. We still need to practice distancing, and the wearing of masks. The choir will still need to be limited to few in number and congregational singing is not permitted. For the present refreshments can only be served for "take out" purposes, this may change as of 17th May.

However, once we reach the 21st June there should be further relaxations of all restrictions.

Shipton Church update

The first stage of the work is now complete; this has involved replacing a substantial amount of stonework on the outside. The removal and repair of the Victorian cast iron supports to the nave clearstory, replacing damaged roof timbers, replastering, and fitting new lights in the nave and west end.

The church is now undergoing a thorough cleaning from head to toe. A big thank you to everyone who has been and currently is involved with the cleaning. Already with the addition of the new lighting the church is looking fantastic. There is a wedding in Shipton on Saturday 5th June, and we aim to have the church looking at its best by then. However, there is a lot more work to be done!

The next stage is to fix the S Aisle roof and of course carry out the improvements – heating, floor, kitchen area, toilets etc.

Diocesan Synod election

Our deanery is represented at Diocesan Synod by two clergy and two lay members. You don't have to be a member of Deanery Synod, but you do need to be enthusiastic about how our Diocese is run, this is open to anyone on the church electoral role although the proposer and seconder need to be Deanery Synod members. If you would like to be nominated or know that someone else would like to be nominated, please contact either Geoffrey or Anne. The proposer and seconder need to be lay members of Deanery Synod but (as I said earlier) the candidate does not. The closing date for nominations is Monday 7th June.

Changes to Marriage Registration from 4 May 2021

The responsibility for registering a marriage now lies with the local civil Registrar of the district where the marriage takes place.

Churches will no longer issue certificates or hold Marriage Registers. Instead, clergy, couples and witnesses will sign a Marriage Document during the Marriage Service which is then sent by the Minister to the Registrar. The couple can then order their marriage certificate/s direct from the Registrar.
