PRAYERS AND READINGS (YEAR C)

Collect Gracious Father, you gave up your Son out of love for the world: lead us to ponder the mysteries of his passion, that we may know eternal peace through the shedding of our Saviour's blood, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Post Communion Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us that what we do for the least of our brothers and sisters we do also for you: give us the will to be the servant of others as you were the servant of all, and gave up your life and died for us, but are alive and reign, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading Philippians 3:4b-14 Paul's former righteousness has been overturned by Christ. Paul longs to be one with him, and presses on to his goal – fulfilling Christ's call.

Gospel John 12:1-8 Jesus attends a dinner at the home of Lazarus. Mary anoints Jesus with costly perfume and so reveals the path of true discipleship.

Liturgy of the Passion

First Reading Philippians 2:5-11 Humility is not about thinking less of yourself, but thinking of yourself less. Christ humbled himself for the benefit of all humanity. Can we imitate that humility for the benefit of those with whom we live?

Gospel Luke 22:14 – end of 23 The themes of service and humility that we have read about in today's readings are personified in Jesus as he institutes the Eucharist on Maundy Thursday.

Liturgy of the Palms

Gospel Luke 19:28-40 Jesus enters Jerusalem and the crowds hail him as their long-awaited Messiah.

The Lord's Supper has become our passover meal. **Gospel John 13:1-17. 31b-35** It is at the very moment of self-emptying that God is nevertheless fully glorified in Jesus. The apparent absence of glory reveals an even greater depth of glory.

First Reading Acts 10:34-43

Peter addresses the Gentile Cornelius, his family and friends, acknowledging that God shows no partiality. He then tells them of the life, death and resurrection of Christ.

Gospel John 20:1-18 Having summoned Peter and the other disciple to the open tomb, Mary Magdalene remains there, weeping, when the others return home. Jesus appears and she mistakes him for the gardener. He calls her by name and she recognises him. He tells her to return to the disciples with a clear message of the resurrection.
