PRAYERS AND READINGS (YEAR C)

Collect God of glory, by the raising of your Son you have broken the chains of death and hell: fill your Church with faith and hope; for a new day has dawned and the way to life stands open in our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen**

Post Communion God of Life, who for our redemption gave your only-begotten Son to the death of the cross, and by his glorious resurrection have delivered us from the power of our enemy: grant us so to die daily to sin, that we may evermore live with him in the joy of his risen life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

First Reading Acts 10:34-43 Peter addresses the Gentile Cornelius, his family and friends, acknowledging that God shows no partiality. He then tells them of the life, death and resurrection of Christ.

Gospel John 20:1-18 Having summoned Peter and the other disciple to the open tomb, Mary Magdalene remains there, weeping, when the others return home. Jesus appears and she mistakes him for the gardener. He calls her by name and she recognises him. He tells her to return to the disciples with a clear message of the resurrection.

Collect Risen Christ, for whom no door is locked, no entrance barred: open the doors of our hearts, that we may seek the good of others and walk the joyful road of sacrifice and peace, to the praise of God the Father. **Amen**

Post Communion Lord God our Father, through our Saviour Jesus Christ you have assured your children of eternal life and in baptism have made us one with him: deliver us from the death of sin and raise us to new life in your love, in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen**

First Reading Acts 5:27-32 (The reading from Acts must be used as either the first or second reading.) Peter and the apostles stand up to the council, proclaiming Jesus as Lord and Saviour.

Gospel John 20:19-end Jesus appears to the disciples on the evening of the first Easter Day, and then a week later to the disciples and Thomas.

Gospel John 21:1-19 New understanding heralds new responsibilities for the renamed Simon Peter, as the resurrected Christ shows himself to him and demonstrates the abundance of God through a miraculous catch of fish.
