#### PRAYERS AND READINGS (YEAR C)

**Collect** Generous God, you give us gifts and make them grow: though our faith is small as mustard seed, make it grow to your glory and the flourishing of your kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen** 

**Post Communion** Lord God, whose Son is the true vine and the source of life, ever giving himself that the world may live: may we so receive within ourselves the power of his death and passion that, in his saving cup, we may share his glory and be made perfect in his love; for he is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen** 

**First Reading Colossians 3:1-11** Paul reminds the Colossians that they are living a completely new life, in Christ, and must strive to live by new standards.

**Gospel Luke 12:13-21** Jesus is asked to adjudicate in a family dispute, but instead tells the story of a man who is rich in material possessions but finds himself poor when he comes to face God at the hour of his death.

### PRAYERS AND READINGS (YEAR C)

**Collect** Lord God, your Son left the riches of heaven and became poor for our sake: when we prosper save us from pride, when we are needy save us from despair, that we may trust in you alone; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen** 

**Post Communion** Strengthen for service, Lord, the hands that have taken holy things; may the ears which have heard your word be deaf to clamour and dispute; may the tongues which have sung your praise be free from deceit; may the eyes which have seen the tokens of your love shine with the light of hope; and may the bodies which have been fed with your body be refreshed with the fullness of your life; glory to you for ever. **Amen** 

**First Reading Hebrews 11:1-3. 8-16** The writer cites Abraham as an example of true faith. Abraham kept to his covenant with God, trusting that God would honour God's promise to give Abraham many descendants.

**Gospel Luke 12:32-40** Jesus tells the gathered people to make sure they are ready to receive God. In order to do this, they should give away any surplus possessions and focus on God rather than on making money.

**Post Communion** Holy Father, who gathered us here around the table of your Son to share this meal with the whole household of God: in that new world where you reveal the fullness of your peace, gather people of every race and language to share in the eternal banquet of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen** 

**First Reading Hebrews I 1:29 – 12:2** The "great cloud of witnesses" of the past lived by faith without knowing the fullness of what God promised: Jesus, who is seated at the right hand of God, is the perfection of God's promises.

**Gospel Luke 12:49-56** Jesus does not bring peace on earth but division; the people need to read the signs of the times.
